### Storm and Evacuation Update

Evacuation orders have been lifted for the homes in the La Canada Flintridge and La Crescenta areas. Residents can now return back to their homes. Those areas include:

- Riverwood Ranch
- Alpine Village
- Zachaou Canyon
- Haines Canyon
- Blanchard Canyon
- 

The next major storm is expected to hit Los Angeles on Wednesday afternoon, January 20, and will continue through Friday. It is expected to result in a significant amount of rainfall in the Station and Sayre burn areas, which increases the risk of flash flooding, mud and debris flow.

Residents living near the foothills and the previous burned areas should obey the direct orders of uniformed public safety officials, and be prepared to evacuate immediately if and when ordered.
